WHAT THIS PRIVACY POLICY COVERS

This Privacy Policy identifies what Personal Data (defined below) is collected about you and how it's used by SXSW when you use the websites sxsw.com, sxswedu.com, schedule.sxsw.com, social.sxsw.com, panelpicker.sxsw.com, cart.sxsw.com, volunteer.sxsw.com, id.sxsw.com, merch.sxsw.com, or other related sites as well as the SXSW and SXSW EDU TV apps and SXSW GO and SXSW EDU GO mobile apps (each, a "Site", and collectively, the "Sites"), apply to, register for, or attend Events, purchase goods or services, or communicate with SXSW (together with the Sites, the "Services").

"Personal Data" means any information that identifies or relates to a particular individual and also includes information referred to as "personally identifiable information," "personal information," or "sensitive personal information" under applicable data privacy laws, rules or regulations.

This Privacy Policy does not cover the practices of companies we don't own or control or people we don't manage, including companies or websites that you access through linked advertisements. Our Sites or emails may include links to external websites of third-party sponsors, SXSW business partners or advertisers. Third parties may use their own cookies, tracking codes, or web beacons when you click on their advertisement or link to their website or service, even if the advertisement simply appears on a page or in an email that you are viewing. In certain situations, you may be temporarily redirected to another website, which may not be apparent to you. We do not control the use of cookies, tracking codes, or web beacons by third parties, or how they manage personal data you provide to them. You should review the privacy policy of the websites you visit to understand their privacy practices before you share personal data.

HOW WE COLLECT PERSONAL DATA

Categories of Sources of Personal Data

We collect Personal Data about you from the following categories of sources:

- When you provide such information directly to us.

- When you voluntarily provide information in free-form text boxes through the Sites or through responses to surveys or questionnaires.
- When you send us an email or otherwise contact us.
- When you make a purchase.
- When you participate in SXSW Events as a speaker, artist, filmmaker, etc.
- When you use the Sites, including when information is collected automatically.
- Through cookies, web beacons, and other tracking technologies (described in the "Tracking Technologies" section below).
- If you download our mobile application or use a location-enabled browser, we may receive information about your location and mobile device, as applicable.
- If you download and install certain applications and software, we make available, we may
 receive and collect information transmitted from your computing device for the purpose of
 providing you with the relevant Services, such as information regarding when you are logged
 on and available to receive updates or alert notices.

Third Parties

- Vendors.
 - We may use analytics providers to analyze how you interact and engage with the Services, or third parties to help us provide you with customer support.
 - We may use vendors to obtain information to generate leads and create user profiles.
- Advertising Partners.
 - We receive information about you from some of our vendors who assist us with marketing or promotional services related to how you interact with our Services, applications, products, services, advertisements or communications.

"CTDPA"), the Delaware Personal Data Privacy Act (the "DPDPA"), the Iowa Consumer Data Protection Act (the "ICDPA"), the Maryland Online Data Privacy Act (the "MDODPA"), the Minnesota Consumer Data Privacy Act (the "MNCDPA"), the Montana Consumer Data Privacy Act (the "MCDPA"), the Nebraska Data Privacy Act (the "NDPA"), the Oregon Consumer Privacy Act (the "OCPA"), the Tennessee Information Protection Act (the "TIPA"), the Texas Data Privacy and Security Act (the "TDPSA"), the New Hampshire Privacy Act (the "NHPA"), the New Jersey Privacy Act (the "NJPA"), the Utah Consumer Privacy Act (the "UCPA"), or the Virginia Consumer Data Protection Act (the "VCDPA"), or other U.S. laws that may become applicable (collectively, the "U.S. State Privacy Laws").

Marketing the Services

- Marketing and selling the Services.
- Showing you advertisements, including Interest-Based Ads (as defined in the "Tracking Technologies" section below).

Corresponding with You

- Responding to correspondence that we receive from you, contacting you when necessary or requested, and sending you information about SXSW or the Services.
- Sending emails and other communications according to your preferences or that display content that we think will interest you.

Meeting Legal Requirements and Enforcing Legal Terms

- Fulfilling our legal obligations under applicable law, regulation, court order or other legal process, such as preventing, detecting and investigating security incidents and potentially illegal or prohibited activities.
- Protecting the rights, property or safety of you, SXSW or another party.
- Enforcing any agreement with you.
- Responding to claims that any posting or other content violates third party rights.
- Resolving disputes.

We will not collect additional categories of Personal Data or use the Personal Data we collected for materially different, unrelated or incompatible purposes without providing you notice.

HOW WE DISCLOSE YOUR PERSONAL DATA

We disclose your Personal Data to the categories of service providers and other parties listed in this section. Depending on state laws that may be applicable to you, some of these disclosures may constitute a "sale" of your Personal Data. For more information, please refer to the "U.S. State Privacy Rights" section below.

- Affiliates. We may disclose certain Personal Data to our corporate affiliates.
- Service Providers. SXSW may engage service providers to help us provide the Services or perform business functions on our behalf. In doing so, these service providers may have access to your Personal Data. Access to your Personal Data by these vendors is limited to the information necessary for it to perform its function for SXSW. For example, if you purchase a badge to attend the Events, we work with online event vendors with whom we share your name and email address to create accounts that allow you to access the online event environment. These service providers may include:
 - o Vendors and suppliers that provide us with technology, services, and/or content related to operation and maintenance of our Sites, the Services, the SXSW systems, and the Events.
 - Analytics providers for web traffic or usage of our Services.
 - Security and fraud prevention consultants.
 - Support and customer service vendors.
 - Product fulfillment and delivery providers.
 - Payment processors.
 - Our payment processing partners, PayPal, Chase Orbital, Shopify, American Express, and Square (and their subsidiary service providers) collect your voluntarily provided payment card information necessary to process your payment. We may also work with additional payment processors who you may already have a relationship with or who may process your personal information with your consent.

- O Please see PayPal's, Chase Orbital's, Shopify's, American Express, Square's and/or 2CP/TPRO's (as applicable) terms of service and privacy policy for information on their use and storage of your Personal Data.
- Advertising Partners. These parties help us market our services and provide you with other offers that may be of interest to you. For example, SXSW works with third party service providers to collect information about your Site activity using common Tracking Technologies (as defined in the "Tracking Technologies" section below). SXSW also uses linked advertisements and newsletters to deliver information to you that is interest-based or about the Event. These Advertising Partners include:
 - Ad networks.
 - Data brokers.
 - Marketing providers.
 - Analytics providers that assist with our Interest-Based Ads.
- **Business Partners.** These parties partner with us in offering various services. For example, SXSW links to co-branded products and/or services to websites hosted and operated by companies other than SXSW, such as video content distributors and hotel reservations providers (each a "Channel Partner Website(s)"). The co-branded SXSW pages that you may access through a Channel Partner Website may have different registration processes and privacy policies. If you visit a Channel Partner Website, please read the privacy policy that is posted on that Channel Partner Website. Our Business Partners may also include:
 - Businesses that you have a relationship with.
 - Companies that we partner with to offer joint promotional offers and opportunities.
- Parties You Authorize, Access or Authenticate.
 - Third parties you access through the services.
 - Sponsors you consent to sharing Personal Data with (for instance, in connection with RFID scans, as discussed <u>here</u>).
 - Other users.

Legal Obligations. We may release your Personal Data to third parties when we have a good faith belief it is necessary (1) to comply with valid legal requirements such as a law, legal investigation, regulation, search warrant, subpoena or court order; or (2) in special circumstances, such as a financial or physical threat to you or others, including, without limitation, if SXSW detects that a fraudulent credit card charge may have occurred.

Business Transfers. All of your Personal Data that we collect may be transferred to a third party if we undergo a merger, acquisition, bankruptcy or other transaction in which that third party assumes control of our business (in whole or in part).

Aggregate Information. SXSW may create aggregated, de-identified or anonymized data from the Personal Data we collect, including by removing information that makes the data personally identifiable to a particular user. Such aggregated, de-identified or anonymized data is not Personal Data and we may provide third parties with such data for our lawful business purposes, including, without limitation, to analyze, build and improve the Sites and Services and to promote our business. For example, we might inform third parties regarding the aggregate number of users of our Sites and Services. We will only maintain and use this information in de-identified form and will not attempt to re-identify the information, except to the extent permitted by applicable law.

TRACKING TECHNOLOGIES

We use common tracking technologies, which include cookies, web beacons, and pixel tags (collectively, "Tracking Technologies") to collect the some of the information detailed in the chart at the beginning of this Privacy Policy. Tracking Technologies are small computer files that we transfer to your computer's hard drive that allow us to know how often you visit the Sites and the activities you conduct while on the Sites or in connection with the Services (e.g., whether you purchase SXSW credentials, referred to here as a "Badge"). We may use information collected by Tracking Technologies to target your online activity, browser, or apps with certain advertisements and/or to determine the popularity of certain content or advertisements. By using a Site or the Services, you agree to SXSW collecting and using your behavioral information for those purposes. Please note that because of our use of Tracking Technologies, the Sites do not support "Do Not Track" requests sent from a browser at this time.

We use the following types of Tracking Technologies:

- <u>Essential</u>. Essential Tracking Technologies are required for providing you with features or services that you have requested. For example, certain Tracking Technologies enable you to log into secure areas of our Services. Disabling these Tracking Technologies may make certain features and services unavailable.
- <u>Functional</u>. Functional Tracking Technologies are used to record your choices and settings regarding our Services, maintain your preferences over time and recognize you when you return to our Services. These Tracking Technologies help us to personalize our content for you, greet you by name and remember your preferences (for example, your choice of language or region).
- Performance/Analytical. Performance/Analytical Tracking Technologies allow us to understand how visitors use our Services. They do this by collecting information about the number of visitors to the Services, what pages visitors view on our Services and how long visitors are viewing pages on the Services. Performance/Analytical Tracking Technologies also help us measure the performance of our advertising campaigns in order to help us improve our campaigns and the Services' content for those who engage with our advertising. For example, Google LLC ("Google") uses Tracking Technologies in connection with its Google Analytics services. The Google Analytics Terms of Service and the Google Privacy Policy govern Google's ability to use and share information collected through Google Analytics. You can prevent your data from being used by Google Analytics by using the Google Analytics Opt-Out tool at www.google.com/privacy_ads.html or the Google Analytics Opt-out Browser Add-on at https://tools.google.com/dlpage/gaoptout/.
- Retargeting/Advertising. Retargeting/Advertising Tracking Technologies collect data about your online activity and identify your interests so that we can provide advertising that we believe is relevant to you. For more information about this, please see the section below titled "Information about Interest-Based or Targeted Advertisements." SXSW works with advertisers that use Tracking Technologies (e.g., LinkedIn Insight Tag, Twitter Pixel, etc.) to collect information about your Site activity and third-party website activity that allows us to customize the content and advertising that is delivered to you. We may also use Tracking Technologies to track our success at reaching audiences and optimize delivery of ad content specifically targeted to your interests based on your use of our Sites. We will not attempt to disaggregate data that third parties report in aggregate.

Deactivating Tracking Technologies. You can decide whether or not to accept some Tracking Technologies through your internet browser's settings. Most browsers have an option for turning off the cookie feature and may allow you to decide on acceptance of some new cookies in a variety of ways. You can also delete all cookies that are already on your device. If you do this, however, you may have to manually adjust some preferences every time you visit our Site and some of the Services and functionalities may not work.

In addition, Tracking Technologies settings on our Sites are available to modify your preferences by clicking here. Information about Interest-Based or Targeted Advertisements. We may serve advertisements, and also allow third party ad networks, including third party ad servers, ad agencies, ad technology vendors and research firms, to serve advertisements through the Services. These advertisements may be targeted to users who fit certain general profile categories or display certain preferences or behaviors ("Interest-Based Ads"). Information for Interest-Based Ads (including Personal Data) may be provided to us by you or derived from the usage patterns of particular users on the Services and/or services of third parties. Such information may be gathered through tracking users' activities across time and unaffiliated properties, including when you leave the Services. To accomplish this, we or our service providers may deliver Tracking Technologies, including a file (known as a "web beacon") from an ad network to you through the Services. Web beacons allow ad networks to provide anonymized, aggregated auditing, research and reporting for us and for advertisers. Web beacons also enable ad networks to serve targeted advertisements to you when you visit other websites. Web beacons allow ad networks to view, edit or set their own Tracking Technologies on your browser, just as if you had requested a web page from their website.

We comply with the Digital Advertising Alliance ("DAA") Self-Regulatory Principles for Online Behavioral Advertising. Through the DAA and Network Advertising Initiative ("NAI"), several media and marketing associations have developed an industry self-regulatory program to give consumers a better understanding of, and greater control over, ads that are customized based on a consumer's online behavior across different websites and properties. Targeted Advertising, "Selling," or "Sharing." Under some U.S. State Privacy Laws, a "share" may also be considered a "sale."

As described in the "Tracking Technologies" section above, we have incorporated Tracking Technologies from certain third parties into our Services. Profile or Contact Data

To our knowledge, we do not sell or share the Personal Data of children under eighteen (18) years of age.

Processing of Sensitive Personal Data. Depending on your state of residence, you may have the right to opt-in or opt-out of our use of your Sensitive Personal Data by following the instructions in the "Exercising Your Rights under U.S. State Privacy Laws" section. If you are a California resident, please note that our use and disclosure of Sensitive Personal Data are limited to the purposes set forth in section 7027(m) of the CCPA regulations, including: 1) performing the services or providing the goods reasonably expected, 2) preventing, detecting, and investigating security incidents, 3) resisting malicious, deceptive, fraudulent, or illegal actions, 4) ensuring physical safety of natural persons, 5) for short-term transient use, 6) performing services on behalf of the business, 7) verifying or maintaining quality or safety of a

product or service, and 8) collecting or processing Sensitive Personal Information but not for the purpose of inferring characteristics. Therefore, we do not offer a way for you to submit such a request.

Anti-Discrimination. We will not discriminate against you for exercising your rights under applicable privacy laws. We will not deny you our goods or services, charge you different prices or rates, or provide you a lower quality of goods and services if you exercise your rights under applicable privacy laws. However, we may offer different tiers of our Services as allowed by applicable data privacy laws with varying prices, rates or levels of quality of the goods or services you receive related to the value of Personal Data that we receive from you.

Notice of Financial Incentive. Subject to additional terms and conditions, we may offer financial incentives, which may change from time to time, including, among other things, tickets or badges for entry to SXSW Events, SXSW branded products and gift cards in return for the collection of your Personal Data through surveys, mailing list sign-ups, or other opportunities we may provide. At the time that any such incentive is offered to you, we may provide you with additional terms and will provide you with an opportunity to opt-in and description of how you can opt-out of such offering. Our good faith estimate of value of your Personal Data in connection with any of our financial incentive programs is reasonably related to the financial incentive provided, taking into consideration our expenses related to the offer, provision, or imposition of any financial incentive or price or service difference, revenue generated by us from the sale, collection, or retention of Personal Data, and the value of any improvements we can make to our products and services based on aggregating information obtained through the financial incentive program.
